2025 Hurricane Preparedness

Hurricane season officially began on June 1st and extends through November 30th.

Whether you have experienced hurricane seasons before or this is your first, preparedness is key to safety. **Know your risk.** Find out how to prepare for weather related events.

Make an emergency plan so everyone knows and understands what to do and where to go. Know your evacuation zone and routes. Recognize warnings and alerts. Get tech ready as you may be without electricity and internet. Gather important documents. Gather supplies for your household for several days.

Stay well informed on an approaching storm will assist you in keeping you and your family safe. Pinellas County, the State of Florida, local news, National Hurricane Center at NOAA, the National Weather Service, Department of Homeland Security, Red Cross, and emergency managers are the best, most trusted sources.

Self-serve Sandbag Events

Pinellas County is already hosting several selfserve sandbag events throughout the County to help residents prepare for hurricane season. Check local news and <u>pinellas.gov</u> for dates and times. Limit 10 bags per resident.



Prepare for Going to a Shelter

Check Pinellas County and local news sources for shelter locations, restrictions, services, and availability. Prepare a travel bag with important documents, medications, contact numbers at a minimum.

Pets and Service Animals

Only service animals trained to perform tasks for a person with a disability are allowed in any shelter. Pet friendly shelters are available but are limited. If you have no other options, call Pinellas County Animal Services at 727-582-2600 to make arrangements for your pet during your shelter stay.
